He differed from the usual readings in some parts, particularly in the following: ‘Many a time—and oft On the Rialto—you have rated me, &c.’ This is certainly better . . . by uniting the *oft* with the Rialto, which is the most public place in Venice, it gives the observation additional force” (*Monthly Magazine*, June 1796, p. 408).
